INTRODUCTION

The GSCASH as a body was set up in Jawaharlal Nehru University in 1999. The body was constituted under the recommendations and guidelines laid down by the historic judgement of Supreme Court of India in the writ petition Vishakha vs. State of Rajasthan. This struggle to form such an institution to fight sexual harassment inside the campus started from grassroot levels where the JNU community was at the forefront.

Today the scenario has changed drastically as the campus has expanded and the nature of complaints are also diverse. GSCASH has faced time and again threats and attacks from various agencies inside and outside the campus.

Very recently, after the horrific incident of 16th December 2012 there were nation-wide protests and demonstrations demanding for a law that could inhibit gender violence before it is perpetrated. As a follow up to this the then government set up a Commission under the chairpersonship of Justice Verma whose recommendations are still far from reality in our legal system. The law that came into being is called the Sexual Harassment at the Workplace Act (2013) which is highly debated on various grounds. Added to it the JNU community also underwent a thorough discussion on the state of gender violence on campus after the 31st July 2013 incident. A 10 member committee was formed which took feedback from different stakeholders on the campus. Their report is also a tool for improving the sensitivity on campus.

Another committee under the chairpersonship of Rector was constituted to update the rules and regulations of GSCASH in accordance with the Law. The approach of GSCASH has been to keep the ethos of this body intact with acceptance of changes which would strengthen the functioning of GSCASH. After many meetings and deliberations the draft was streamlined within GSCASH and is now waiting to be implemented by the Rector Committee.

GSCASH along with the support of the JNU community has tried to understand and analyse various issues related to gender through discussions, public meetings, film screenings, street plays and workshops. With the sole agenda of making JNU a zero tolerant campus towards sexual harassment, GSCASH interacted with not just the students' community but also with the security and

workers on campus. GSCASH sensitized them about harassment, violence and created awareness about the role of GSCASH in case of any untoward incident.

Gender Sensitization Activities and Programmes:

Self Defence Workshop in coordination with the Sports Office

A workshop was organised along with the Sports office where women trainers from Delhi Police taught the students basics of self defence. It was organised in Teflas and the methods taught were to deal with daily based violence on streets, buses and other public places.

Letter to the Rector for better facilities in Parlor

After consistent demands from girl students, a letter was written to the Rector highlighting the problems faced by the student s availing the facilities of Parlor. The letter pointed the basic problems: small space and more number using these facilities, safety issues as there are different appliances used, privacy matter as it faces the road and visitors have to wait outside, etc. Even after submission of an application there is no progress in the matter neither any response.

Notice on the Landmark Judgement

A notice was put up congratulating and informing the student community about the recognition of the transgenders and *Hijras* as 'Third Gender'. This came about with a judgement by NALSA on 15th April 2014. It spoke about the Supreme Court verdict of declaring LGBTIQ 'illegal' under Section 377. GSCASH took it as its responsibility to work towards creating equal spaces for all where binaries of gender are not the only modules of functioning.

Brochure Distribution

During the time of new admissions in JNU GSCASH distributed brochures containing the information about the role and procedures of GSCASH. It also defined harassment and basic concerns of when and to whom the complaint of

sexual harassment be made. The brochure also gave a list of members so that in cases of emergency anyone can be contacted. The brochure is also translated in Hindi for wider circulation among the JNU community. GSCASH students' representatives interacted with the new students generating awareness about the committee. A poster to call for volunteers to help during admission assistance, was put before the admissions and there were 4 volunteers who helped the student representatives manage the desk.

Street Play

A Delhi based street play group called Jana Natya Manch was invited for an interactive session with the students. Here the artists engaged the students in an artistic response to the increasing incidents of violence against women. They improvised on the experiences of the violence narrated by the students. These improvisations acted as 'provocations' for many to talk, share and articulate through the responses from the artists.

Public Meeting

A discussion was held after the November 11, 2014 incident in Bilaspur, Chattisgarh where during the process of sterilisation 15 women died and many more were hospitalised. The title of the meeting was- *Governmentality and Public Health: lessons from Chattisgarh*. The idea behind the meeting was to open discussion on such instances of violence which are not new, unleashed by the state on the poor and deprived sections of women in the name of welfare.

On 24.02.2015 a public meeting was organised on the topic: Moral policing: where to find it, how to fight it, where Kalki Koechlin, an actor, came to speak on the topic. It was organised at Sabarmati Dhaba around 6 PM. The discussion revolved around the idea of moral policing and how it penetrates our everyday lives. The speaker spoke about her personal experiences and how she dealt with such issues.

Important Notice

As mentioned earlier that there was a need for updating the GSCASH rules and regulations and for this purpose a committee under the chairpersonship of Rector was constituted. After several discussions, GSCASH decided to open the debate with the larger JNU community. The poster spoke about the SHW Act 2013 and its inconsistencies with the GSCASH. A resolve was taken to keep up the autonomy of GSCASH intact and struggle to resist any regressive moves.

Call for Volunteers

Before announcing the sensitization workshop GSCASH decided to call upon student volunteers to help in the management and organisation of these sessions. To make it more decentralised the hostel committees and union members were involved. The idea was to have smooth coordination and greater dissemination through these representatives.

Sensitization Workshop

A week long sensitization programme was prepared by the members of GSCASH covering almost the entire JNU community in different sessions. There were school level sessions in the first half and then to involve more students dhaba sessions in the evening for four days. Rest of the days attempts were made to interact with the workers on campus, staff and officers and security staff. However there were obstructions in its implementation but as an institution GSCASH expanded its limits.

The orientation involved participation and a small discussion with former GSCASH faculty members and faculty in general. This was followed by videos provoking discussion around stereotypes and stigma in society. In the evening there were activities planned with the help of other members where students spoke about myths and taboos.

Cultural Nights

GSCASH brought out a notice on 26.02.2015 requesting students to refrain from making sexist, derogatory and offensive statements through public and cultural spaces in JNU in the name of 'entertainment'. GSCASH urged the entire JNU community to introspect on the nature of programs that are currently being organized as part of cultural nights

Holi Celebration

GSCASH brought out a notice wishing the entire JNU community on holi. It also urged people to respect each other's space and take consent while playing colors. In all the idea was to remind that 'fun' should never be exclusionary and insensitive.

Reforms in the rules and procedures of GSCASH

A committee was formed within GSCASH to study the SHW Act 2013 and suggest changes to the current GSCASH rules and procedures. The Rector proposed to the GSCASH members in the meeting to formulate new rules within a month. It was after lot of hard work and thorough study of each and every clause that a new draft was prepared. This committee of 5 members then placed the draft in front of the entire GSCASH membership. After continuous deliberation on the suggestions of the members, the draft is finally approved and submitted to the Rector. The Draft is a vision where the attempts are to strengthen the institution and safeguard it from any attack.

International Women's Day March

GSCASH organized a march on the occasion of International Women's Day on 8th March, 2015. Students marched raising slogans and holding playcards for Gender Equality, Freedom and Rights.

The above mentioned table gives an idea of the number of cases that were lodged year wise. However, they should not be taken in absolute terms as lot depends on the membership and with the break in term of Chairpersons and other members, redressal get delayed even after continuous hard work by the GSCASH membership.

Till the 30th April 2015 the status of the complaints in GSCASH was such: there were 3 enquiries that were completed, around 10 complaints were such where either the enquiry committee was constituted or the enquiry was underway. There are almost 8 complaints which are undergoing the Complaint Screening Committee procedure. Lastly, almost 4 complaints were withdrawn on different grounds. The cases involved different individuals from campus say student, mess worker, staff, officer, faculty, etc. and also from outside. The complaints were of a variety of concerns: internet crime, stalking, unwanted sexual advances in person, text messages and sometimes serious in nature. The pressures from all these complaints were of different kinds as sometimes the defendant is non-cooperative while in some instances the recommendations are not implemented making GSCASH look like a failed body. After all allegations members were committed to bring complaints to rest appropriately.

RTIs

Many RTIs concerning cases were forwarded to us by the University Authority were responded promptly and Replies were sent to them. Many Court cases were also received from the Legal Cell for our para-wise comments which was also responded in time and as per rules of the GSCASH.

Roadblocks

The journey in GSCASH has been full of difficulties and challenges. Down below is the summary of those concerns:

- Delays in filling the vacancies of members
- Difficulty in strictly following the procedures due to shortage of members.
- Inadequate staff with required specialisation.
- Difficulty in getting members from outside the campus for instance, NGO, etc.
- Infrastructural delays

- Maintenance of confidentiality
- Lack of counselling services
- Absence of legal advice within GSCASH
- Conflicts due to RTIs
- Non implementation of GSCASH recommendations by the administration on speedy basis on non serious grounds

Suggestions

In this present scenario following suggestions might help overcome the obstacles for a smooth working of the GSCASH.

- 1. The elections to GSCASH in all sections should be held regularly so that the membership is sufficient at all times for the functioning.
- 2. The proposed changes to the rules and procedures of GSCASH should be implemented immediately so as to strengthen the body.
- 3. Permanent staff with a Section Officer, bi-lingual typist should be attached with the body
- 4. The proposal for the counsellor panel only with GSCASH should be considered with utmost seriousness
- 5. Similarly a panel of NGOs should also be prepared for smooth conduct of the enquiries
- 6. The rule book and forms should be tried and translated in hindi as well.
- 7. Stringent measures to check the breach of confidentiality should be taken
- 8. A guideline to the functioning of the members on everyday basis should be prepared to avoid conflicts within members
- 9. A permanent legal advisor should be given to GSCASH
- 10. Directive to other departments should be given to assist GSCASH rather than increasing its burden of work
- 11. Centres and schools should also cooperate during GSCASH workshop and take the initiatives to interact with students, staff and faculty on these lines for a gender equal campus

We have been noting that programs organized as part of 'cultural nights' in various hostels often perpetrate the patriarchal common sense in society such as songs which objectify women and are sexist and misogynist.

JNU has always tried to collectively ensure that everyone feels equally comfortable and free in our public and private spaces. GSCASH urges the entire JNU community to introspect on the nature of programs that are currently being organized as part of cultural nights. We are certainly not against students getting together to have fun. But when 'fun' begins to make several people uncomfortable, this 'fun' can lead to our cultural spaces excluding, instead of including the entire JNU community, which we believe would be highly unfortunate. At a time when women's freedom and autonomy are being discussed across the country, we believe that in JNU too, it is high time that we rethink our idea of what constitutes 'fun' and 'entertainment'.
